- **Revise finding fractions and percentages of amounts.**
- Convert different units of measurement.
- Practise identifying money and adding money, can you find out how much change someone would get if they bought certain items?
- **Practise solving word problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Use My Maths to try different activities.**
