<b>Phonics</b>	<p><b>What's in the Box?</b> See Mrs Thomas' demonstration video on Class Dojo.</p> <p>Use a range of initial sounds.</p>	<p><b>Blending Game</b> Select 5 objects and put them all on the floor together. Then sound out a word such as c-a-t and see if your child can blend the sounds to make cat and select the correct object. Remember, they do not need to see the letters at this stage.</p>	<p><b>'P' Sound Hunt</b> Practise making the 'p' sound. Remember, it is a bouncy sound. Now go on a hunt and collect different objects that start with the 'p' phoneme (pencil, pot, pizza, pineapple, etc...). Upload a photo with all the objects you managed to find in the Class Portfolio area on the Class Dojo website.</p>	<p><b>George's Gym</b> Watch Mrs Thomas' video. Mrs Thomas will give you instructions but she will segment and you must blend and then do the action.</p>	<p><b>Sound Walk</b> Take a sound walk. On the walk, stop and take the time to listen to the sounds around you. Some sounds will be loud, others will be quieter sounds.</p>
	<p>Watch Mrs Thomas' Story Time on Class Dojo</p> <p>Name Collage - write your child's name on a piece of paper/cardboard.</p> 	<p>Number Towers - Write numbers 1-10 on a piece of paper. Place them facedown and ask your child to select three. Encourage them to place the numbers in order (e.g. they pick 7, 2, 6 - child orders 2, 6, 7).</p>	<p>Handwriting - watch Mrs Thomas' handwriting video on Class Dojo and complete at home. Upload a photo of your handwriting on Class Dojo. Use whatever tools you have (pencil and paper, paint, whiteboard, crayons...).</p>
