YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION CHECK: Last week, Year 4 took part in a national Year 4 Multiplication Check trial. The National Curriculum specifies that pupils should be taught to recall the multiplication tables up to and including 12 × 12 by the end of year 4. It is so important that pupils can recall their times tables fluently, as this will support their future success in mathematics. We encourage pupils to practise their times tables and from Year 2 upwards, remember that you can use online websites such as Times Tables Rockstars <https://play.ttrockstars.com/> Keep practising everyone!

COVID RESTRICTIONS: You will have heard on the news how thousands of children are needing to isolate at home because of having close contact with a child who has had a positive test.

There have been many children recently who we have sent home because of a continuous cough. I understand that this might be due to an allergy but we are duty bound to follow government guidance which states that children with a continuous cough need to go home and have a covid test.

I have been informed that some parents have been told, at a test centre, that their child does not need a covid test. As a school we give you the guidance that we have been told. It is very difficult for everyone when conflicting advice is given.
