MOBILE PHONES: A reminder that mobile phones are only allowed to be brought into school by pupils in year 6 who walk home by themselves. For your child's safety 'SMART' phones ARE NOT allowed. This policy has been endorsed by the local police officers who visit the school. They inform us that most children are mugged for their mobile phone.

MOBILE PHONE USE IN THE PLAYGROUND: We see more and more parents coming to drop off and pick up their children whilst talking on a mobile phone. I understand that there are important calls that cannot be ignored. However, it makes the children so happy if they are given their parent's full attention when they are collected from school at the end of the day. This gives you the opportunity to chat to your child and find out about their day without distraction.
