

# **CHRISTMAS AT OUR LADY OF THE VISITATION:**

**KS1 - ADVENT LITURGY:** We began our Journey to Christmas with an Advent Liturgy service, led by year 1 and 2. Father Liam joined us as we lit the first Advent candle and celebrated the beginning of the Christmas story. The Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary and then Mary & Joseph travelled to Bethlehem as we all sang `Little Donkey`. We thought about the gifts from God of Love, Joy, Hope and Peace as we prepare over the next few weeks for his greatest gift of all.





This was followed by the Carol concert performed by the Choirs of Cardinal Wiseman High School and Our Lady of the Visitation Primary school. These services marked the beginning of a time of waiting and preparing for the birth of Jesus.







**THE INFANT CHRISTMAS PLAYS**: The Advent Services were followed by The Infant Christmas plays. These were joyous celebrations depicting the birth of Jesus. The children sang like Angels, recited lines like true performers, danced and looked utterly amazing in their costumes.

























**JUNIOR CAROL SERVICE:** Our celebrations culminated with the Junior Carol Service where the children created the Nativity scene through readings and song. This is always such a beautiful service and one that brings real JOY into our lives.

**YEAR 1 TOYS FROM THE PAST WORKSHOP**: In year 1, we have been learning about toys from the past through our English and History lessons this half term. We have also been learning about the materials they are made from in our Science lessons and we are in the process of making real toys to play with in DT.

On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> October we took part in a workshop where a lady called Liz let us explore many toys that children in the past would have played with. We finished the morning with a fantastic puppet show.





**YEAR 1 MOZART WORKSHOP:** We were lucky to experience a musical repertoire from the Mozart artists as they played classical music for us on the piano and the cello. It was great fun listening to the different notes and tempo, the instruments were played at. We were able to touch the cello strings to feel the vibrations when the bow touched the strings.





**LITTER PICKING:** The Mini Vinnies have teamed up with LAGERCAN (Litter Action Group for Ealing Residents) and have been litter picking in the local area. They collected 5 bags of rubbish in 30 minutes.





**YEAR 3 STONE AGE WORKSHOP:** On December the 14<sup>th</sup>, we welcomed in Dan from Portals to the Past, who took the Year 3 children back in time all the way to Stone Age Britain. The children explored the time frame of the past and could visually see how their 7 or 8 years compared to the amount of time Britain was in the Stone Age.

The children learned about the different animals that would have been in Britain at the time and thought about which ones are extinct now and which ones have continued to evolve over time. Dan also showed the children real artefacts that are from these animals, including a real woolly mammoth tusk.

In the afternoon, the children continued their journey through time as they experienced the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. The children all had the opportunity to touch real animal bones, fossils and other interesting artefacts from across the ages, including obsidian stone, a real cave bear claw and a genuine seal skin.

Daniel 3G said, "The thing I enjoyed the most was that I got to hold a giant hunting bow and arrow from the Stone Age".

Ashlyn 3G said, "The part I enjoyed most was getting to touch all of the animal bones and the rocks."

Ethel from 3R said, "I loved when I was able to touch the horse's bones. There were big and bit sticky."

Max from 3R said "I love that I was able to touch the obsidian. It came from a volcano and it's like a glass."





**YEAR 4 SAXON VILLAGE TRIP:** This year, our enthusiastic Year 4 students embarked on an exciting and educational journey to Butser Ancient Farm in Hampshire. The trip offered a unique opportunity for the children to step back in time and experience life as an Anglo-Saxon.

Despite the unpredictable weather, the day was filled with hands-on activities that brought the past to life. The students had the chance to engage in various immersive experiences, such as carving Saxon letters into chalk, handling artefacts, crafting Saxon jewellery, and delving into the art of Saxon writing. One student said "I loved the trip because we got to see how the Saxons lived over 1000 years ago and we actually have a lot more in common with them than I thought."





**TREES FOR CITIES:** Over the last few weeks, our children have been involved in a huge tree planting project, both in school and in our local environment. Our school project was funded by Trees For Cities, and hasn't cost the school a penny!!

Half of the children in the school were involved in preparing, digging, planting, mulching many different trees and sensory plants, and a hedgerow on our school field.

It will become a wonderful place for our children to care for, relax, play and learn. Not only that, but will be a new habitat for nature and wildlife, and will help to absorb carbon and produce oxygen for us to breathe, and provide shade in the summer. Children learnt the benefits of planting trees with the experts from Trees For Cities who came to school to manage this project with us.
