THE CANONISATION OF CARLO ACUTIS: On Sunday, along with the other Ealing Catholic Headteachers, I had the privilege of attending the canonization Mass for St Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati in Rome. These were two ordinary young men, Carlo just 15 and Pier 24, who lived a life of faith and dedication to helping others and introducing Jesus to everyone they met. They are a testament to the strength of youth and remind us that we too can be saints.

The Mass was celebrated by Pope Leo XVI and attended by tens of thousands of people. It was a deeply moving experience.

SCHOOL UNIFORM – PE KITS:

- Trainers are only allowed on PE days and must be black.
- Plain round neck navy T-Shirt.
- Plain navy blue shorts (no leggings)
- Navy track suit top and bottoms.

We have a lovely PE kit with the logo. However, if these are too expensive you may wear a kit without a logo but it **MUST** be plain navy blue.

PE Kits must be worn to school on PE days. Your child will be informed of the day.

SCHOOL UNIFORM: Pupils in year 1 – year 6 must be **wearing their winter uniform**. This is;

- A plain white shirt (**buy these a bit bigger so they are not tight and uncomfortable around the neck**)
- School tie
- School V neck jumper. (The school track suit top must **not** be worn with a shirt and tie)
- Grey trousers for boys
- Blue trousers, skirts or pinafores for the girls.
- **Plain GREY socks** for boys
- **BLUE tights or plain WHITE socks** without frills or bows for girls.
- All shoes must be black. **Boots are not allowed.**



Please **NAME EVERYTHING**, as countless jumpers, and other items, cannot be returned to their owners unless we know who to give them to. If you purchase pre loved uniform, PLEASE take the old name/label out and rename for your child!

🔥 ⚠️ PARENT & CARER ALERT: "THE SALT & ICE CHALLENGE"

A dangerous online trend is resurfacing where children put salt on their skin and press ice on top.

- 👉 This causes serious cold burns (like frostbite).
- 👉 Injuries can need hospital treatment and even skin grafts.
- 👉 Young people may not realise the damage until it's too late.

✅ First Aid: warm area with immersion in warm water for 30 – 60 minute, cover with clean cling film, and seek medical help.

❌ Do NOT Rub or massage the area to avoid further tissue damage, Do Not use ice, creams, or fluffy dressings.
