We heard from celebrities who have stood up against racism.

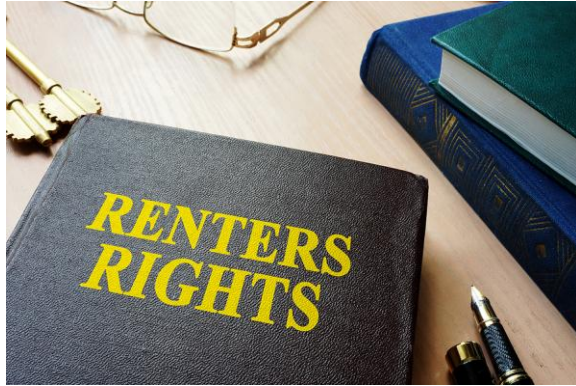
We remembered that we are all made in the image and likeness of God, all beloved by him and unique. We are all called to stand up to those who make racist comments or actions just because a person may not look like them.

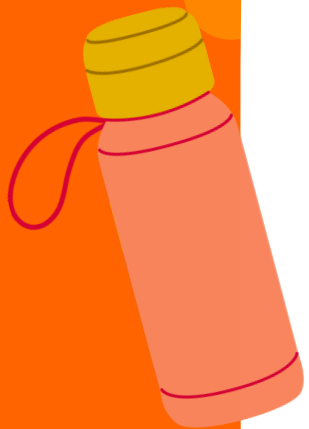

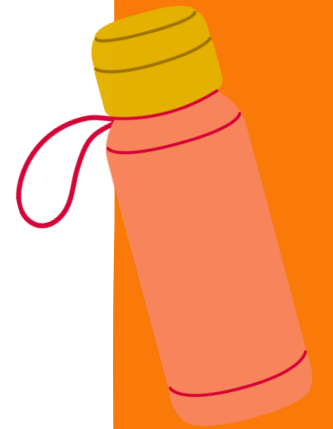
Ealing residents facing **immediate financial hardship or urgent need for essentials**
