VACCINATION - PROTECTING YOUR CHILD: The current outbreak of meningitis in Kent is a timely reminder about the importance of vaccinating our children against serious, potentially life-threatening disease such as Meningitis, Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR). All these diseases are controllable through vaccination.

Herd immunity only occurs if 95% of children receive the recommended two doses of the MMR vaccination by the age of 5. Current uptake is less than 85% with London having the lowest uptake at 73.3%. This has resulted in a number of registered cases of measles, a disease that was eradicated in this country.

E-Safety Tip:

In the same way that you set rules for most areas of your children's lives, establish your expectations regarding online activities.

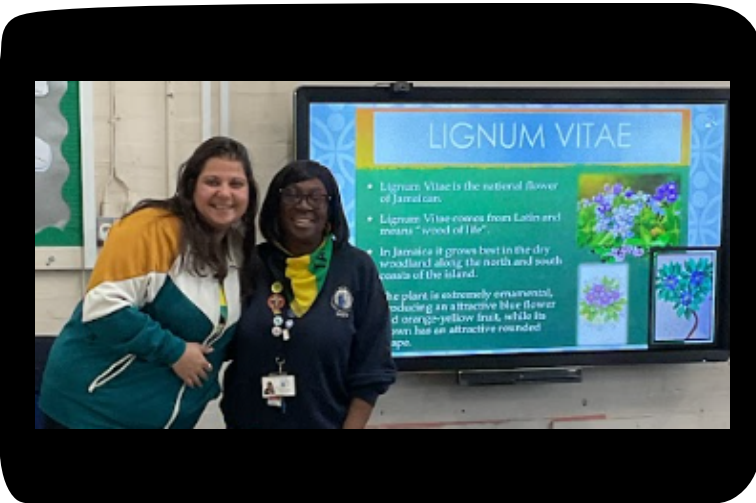


The Eco Team have arranged for a battery recycling drive at school. The box is in the front office. Please **ONLY** bring batteries labelled on the box.
