**KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE AT THE END OF THE DAY:** The only way we can ensure children are sent home safely with an adult or older sibling is if the teacher sees who each child is collected by. A number of parents are standing a distance from where their children line up. This is a safety concern as the playground is so busy and the children are having to navigate their way through a crowd of adults. Therefore, you are asked to go towards the line so that staff can see you meet your child. We often have occasions when another member of the family comes to collect a child who has already gone home with a brother, sister or family friend and we need to be able to say who it is who has collected them.

**INCLEMENT WEATHER:** For anyone who may have missed the ClassDojo message this week I want to clarify procedures for the end of the day when the weather is bad.

If there is torrential rain or hail stones you will be asked to shelter under one of the canopies until it has calmed down.

Staff have been asked to keep the children inside until the rain/hailstones have passed. We ask for your patience while the storm peters out.

The children will line up in their usual place and you will be asked to collect them from the line.
